



Camp Pomperaug is located adjacent to the Massachusetts border in Northeast Connecticut, in Union, easily accessible from Exit 74 of I-84 and within easy access of Sturbridge Village and UCONN programs. The Camp consists of 160-acres of forest including our own Wells Pond, as well as access to Lake Mashapaug, one of the most beautiful lakes in Connecticut with record breaking fishing opportunities. Our Camp is surrounded by Nipmunk State Forest.

The Camp is operational year round except in July due to summer resident camp programs. At least one weekend each month has been earmarked for Scouting use and alternative dates are also available with 60 days advance notice. We welcome all Scouting units to experience Camp Pomperaug.

Year-round programs consist of tent, lean-to or lodge camping, fishing, hiking, water sports, canoeing, boating, cross country skiing sports and/or improvised games/outdoor activities. A Campmaster will be available to help you have a fun Scouting weekend.

Reservation Information & Weekends Available

Availability:

- One weekend a month (except for July) has been reserved for Scout use. Alternate dates are available with a minimum of 60 days notice.
- Camp Pomperaug is reserved for the Connecticut Burns Foundation's exclusive use from July 1-31. Unit reservation requests during this time will not be accepted.
- The camp dining hall and multipurpose building may be reserved for Council and/or District events only.
- The COPE Area is off limits to campers.
- Well's Pond and Lake Mashapaug is open for boating or swimming but an adult leader trained in Safe Swim Defense/Safety Afloat must be present at all times Scouts are in/on the water.

Reservations:

- Contact Carolyn Cruson, Council Camping Registrar, at (203) 876-6868, Ext. 273 or email carolyn.cruson@scouting.org to reserve weekend camping.
- As required with all of our properties, a Tour Permit is required for entry to the camp. Units arriving without an approved Tour Permit will be denied entry.
- Check-in/Check-out with the camp Caretaker or Campmaster is required.
- A \$100 refundable deposit is required at the Council Resource Center. Deposits will be returned upon showing evidence of proper check-out by the Camp Caretaker or Campmaster. Deposit may be used to cover costs of repair of damage, cleaning services, trash removal, fee for facilities used but not reserved, and for campers not included on the reservation.

Miscellaneous:

- Emergency services are available by calling 911. There is no phone service at Camp Pomperaug so units should ensure at least one cell phone is brought to camp.
- All refuse must be taken away, i.e., "Pack out what you packed in."
- Report any hazards or urgent maintenance issues to the Camp Caretaker or Campmaster so appropriate action can be taken.
- There is no snow removal service beyond the gate to the camp's entrance. Plan accordingly.
- Potable water is available at an outdoor spigot at the Caretaker's house.

- There is no program equipment currently available at Camp Pomperaug. Units should be prepared to conduct/resource their own weekend activities.
- Privately owned vehicles must be parked in designated parking areas.
- All used facilities should be left better than you found them. Replenish firewood, ensure latrines and sites are cleaned before contacting Caretaker or Campmaster for check-out.
