MANAGERS ALERTED

HIGH COMMISSIONS

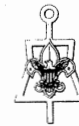

CAMP STAFF 1972



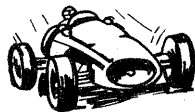

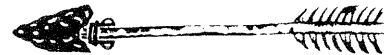
